What do you get when you cross Camellia japonica with Camellia sasanqua? You get the best of two worlds: The graceful, semi-weeping habit of Christmas Carol makes it useful for those who find japonicas too stiff and stodgy in the landscape. Red, bell-shaped flowers with white, picotee borders begin in fall, with their grandest display during the Christmas season.

Well-drained garden soil with rich organic matter

Yearly in spring

Shape after bloom cycle in early spring
